

The Western College, Konthoujam, was established on 5 October 1980, located in the historic and beautiful landscape of Konthoujam near Imphal-Jiribam road NH-37, about 14 kilometres from the heart of the capital, Imphal City. The college is spread across 7.36 acres and has adequate infrastructure. Establishing a college in the locality was a long-cherished dream of the general public in the area. The college is, in fact, a by-product of the ceaseless efforts of some pioneers of the locality. The main objective of establishing such a college is to impart quality-based higher education to the new generations and to facilitate rural students' acquisition of higher education. With its long history and perseverance, the College has been one of the pioneer institutions in imparting knowledge and guidance to young minds. 1.1 Bachelor's Degree Program:

The college adheres to Office Order No/793 dated 24 November 2022 of Manipur University Admission and Examination Regulations 2022 for the Four-year Undergraduate Programmes in Science, Arts and Other Streams. The Undergraduate academic programmes governed by the Ordinance shall be of four-year duration with multiple entry-exit options within this period with appropriate certifications as follows,

- 1.3 National Education Policy: 2020 (N.E.P. 2020): The N.E.P. 2020 envisages a holistic and multidisciplinary education to produce employable graduates with integrated personalities. The policy envisions the undergraduate degree to be of either 3- or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period and with appropriate certifications, e.g. a certificate after one year of study or a diploma after two years of study or a Bachelor's degree after three years of study. The 4-year programme will lead to either a Bachelor's degree with Honours in a discipline or a Bachelor's degree with Research if the student completes a rigorous research project in a major area of study specified by the University.
- 1.4 Multiple Entry and Exit Points: These are stages where the students may have options for entry and exit in the academic programmes in Higher Education Institutions to be facilitated through the facility created by the Academic Bank Credit scheme in the manner as provided in the UGC "Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions".

(A) Bachelor's Certificate:

The Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline is obtainable after one year (two semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies four core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and a minimum of 3 Value Addition Courses (VAC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 46 Credits.

(B) Bachelor's Diploma:

The Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline is obtainable after 2 years (four semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 10 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 4 Value Addition Courses (VAC) and 2 Generic Elective courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 96 Credits.

(C) Bachelor's Degree:

The Bachelor's Degree in a discipline is obtainable after 3 years (six semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree (i.e., B.Sc/B.A.) in a discipline degree may be awarded if a student studies 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 5 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses and minimum 3 Generic Elective (GE) courses, with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 140 Credits.

(D) Bachelor's Degree with Honours:

The Bachelor's Degree with Honours in a discipline is obtainable after four years (eight semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Degree with Honours (i.e., B.A. (Honours)/ B.Sc. (Honours)) in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 18 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 5 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and minimum 4 Generic Elective Courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 182 Credits.

(E) Letter Grade and Grade Point :

The 10-point grading system of the UGC, as described below, will be adopted for the assessment and examination of the performance of students in various courses of the undergraduate programmes.

Letter Grade is used to signify the level of qualitative/quantitative academic achievement of a student in a Course, while the Grade Point is used to indicate the numerical weight of the Letter Grade on a 10-point scale. Letter Grades' O' to 'P' indicate successful completion of a Course, while Letter Grades' F' and 'Ab' indicate 'fail' and 'Absent' respectively.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The college has one NSS Units with a total strength of 100 volunteers. Our volunteers are involved in various college and nearby village activities, such as gardening, tree planting, and constructing village roads. NSS volunteers are also actively associated with burning social issues, such as awareness campaigns on crimes against women and environmental protection.

GAMES & SPORTS

The college has a large playground with ample space for constructing and expanding indoor and outdoor games and sports activities. Our students participated in various national games and sports tournaments representing the college through Manipur University.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Though the college was founded in 1980, the 'Western College Alumni Association' was only inaugurated on 18 March 2016. All the ex-students, particularly the graduates from this college, are members of this association. Since its inception, the association has been progressing well, fulfilling its objectives under the governance of the association's president, secretary, etc.

LIBRARY

The college has a separate library containing books and other documentation facilities. The number of books is about 15,000, and more are added yearly. In addition to textbooks and reference books, e-journals and periodicals are also subscribed to through N-list, which offers an accessible Wi-Fi facility. The college library is now fully automated. A new library building will be constructed and extended in the coming years.

HEALTHCARE FACILITIES

The college keeps first-aid kits to immediately relieve minor injuries and sicknesses before referring them to a designated healthcare unit. Besides, one Primary Health Sub-Centre (PHSC) and a Community Health Centre (CHC) are within a half-kilometre radius of the college. Easily accessible medical shops are available within the vicinity of the college campus.

OTHER FACILITIES

Well-equipped Computer Laboratory, Science Laboratory, Xerox at concessional rate, exemption of admission fee for the 3rd child of the family, awards for toppers of B.A./B.Sc. Examinations, internet, Wi-Fi, LAN facilities, and free admission for physically challenged students are also available.

2. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION TO UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES:

Candidates seeking admission to undergraduate courses should apply offline/online. The form, complete in all respects, is to be filled in by the candidate and copies of the documents must be submitted to the college in person/through the college website www.westerncollege.ac.in.

A student applying for admission to B.A./B.Sc.-First-year is advised to choice only one core subject from the list provided under the courses offered.

3. UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES:

- **3.1 B.A. Programme**: The students who have passed the 10+2 or an equivalent examination are accepted as equivalent by the Manipur. University with 33% marks (including English). The students opting for Mathematics as one of the study subjects must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% in Mathematics at the 10+2 level. However, a student who has passed the qualifying examination in the Arts stream will be given preference in the B.A. programme.
- **3.2 B.Sc. Programme**: The students seeking admission to B.Sc. have to pass 10+2 or an equivalent examination, accepted as equivalent by the Manipur University with pass marks in Science subjects with English with 45% marks.
 - All admissions to the B.A./B.Sc. program will be based on the merit of the 10+2 examination, considering the best subject, including English.
 - Admission against quotas meant for outstanding sportswomen and outstanding students in cultural activities shall be made only once at the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify for the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under the rules.

- Only those students participating in the national level tournaments will be considered for the sports quota.
- Only those students who have secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in the National Level in cultural events will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
- It will be mandatory for the students admitted against Sports and Cultural quotas to participate in sports/cultural events.
- Original certificates will have to be produced when demanded by the college authority. The
 dates for the same will be displayed on the college website and notice board.
- The candidates applying for sports and cultural quotas should deposit the hard copy of the admission form along with the supporting documents on or before the date to be notified by the college.

3.3 CHOICE OF CORE COURSES IN B.A./B.Sc. FIRST-YEAR

- Core Course: This course is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete a programme requirement in a said discipline/subject of study.
- Elective Course: Generally, an elective course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses which may be very specific, specialised, advanced or supportive to the Core Course/discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill.
- A candidate has to choose one subject/discipline as the core course of his/her choice, and he/ she must select at least one generic/elective paper from the group under Generic Elective Course (GEC).
- Choosing a subjects/a course by a candidate does not guarantee admission to a particular course.
- The curriculum for the 4-year undergraduate programme shall be based on the LOCF-CBCS system of the UGC, with value-added courses envisaged in the N.E.P. 2020.

1.2 GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION:

- Candidates seeking admission to the above classes should apply online/offline. The form, complete
 in all respects, is to be filled in by the candidate, and copies of the uploaded documents must be
 submitted through the college website, www.westerncollege.ac.in.
- A student applying for admission to B.A./B.Sc.- First-year students are advised to take one of the subjects/courses of his/her choice.
- Subject-wise merit lists will be displayed on the **college website** and the **notice board** on the scheduled dates.
- The admission form recommended by the Admission Committee and approved by the Principal entitles a student to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
- A candidate who fails to deposit the fee/dues by the prescribed date and time shall forfeit her right to admission. The seat shall be offered to the next student on the merit list, for which the notices will be displayed on the official website accordingly. In no case shall the third merit list be issued.
- The roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per the rules of Director University and Higher Education, Manipur.
- Incomplete admission forms and those without proper documentation /copies of uploaded documents will not be entertained.
- No admission whatsoever shall be made after the due date.
- All admissions will be as per the admission schedule notified by Manipur University, Manipur.

2. DOCUMENTS AND CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FOR APPLYING ADMISSION:

- Passport size photograph (2)
- Copy of Matriculation certificate
- Copy of 10+2 certificate
- Copy of the original **Character certificate** from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- A copy of the certificate issued by the competent authority should be enclosed to avail of the reservation benefit in the category concerned if it is a reservation category or a particular caste.
- If the candidate has gap year in the academic career, he/she should be submitted Affidavit.
- An equivalence eligibility certificate from a Board/University for the candidates who have passed 10+2 from a Board other than the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur (COHSEM)/ICSE/CBSE.

- Copy of the original Migration/Registration certificate for all the candidates who have passed from a Board/Council/University including the Council of Higher Secondary Education Manipur should be submitted to the college at the time of admission.
- Copy of Aadhar card.

Note: Admission without any of the abovementioned documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk. The candidate must produce all his/her original certificates for verification when demanded by the Admission Committee/College office on the dates displayed on the notice board and the college website.

SELECTION PROCEDURE:

- The Admission Committee of the college will scrutinise the candidates' admission forms.
- Subject-wise merit lists will be displayed on the college website and notice board on the scheduled
 dates.
- The admission form recommended by the Admission Committee and approved by the Principal entitles a student to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
- A candidate who fails to deposit the fee/dues by the prescribed date and time shall forfeit her right to admission, and the seat shall be offered to the next student in the merit list for which the notices will be displayed on the official website, accordingly.
- The roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per the rules of Manipur University, Imphal.
- Incomplete admission forms and those without copies of uploaded/supporting documents will not be entertained.
- No admission whatsoever shall be made after the due date.
- All admissions will be as per the admission schedule notified by the Directorate of University and Higher Education, Govt. of Manipur, from time to time.

All the students enrolled on the college should strictly follow the following guidelines for maintaining uniformity and harmony in all respects during their studentship:


- Every student must be a bona-fide student of the Western College, Konthoujam.
